Eastport

Consisting entirely of islands, the City of Eastport is the easternmost city in the United States. Eastport embodies America at its most natural, most serene, and most inviting. Surrounded by the waters of Passamaquoddy Bay, it is the city where the sun first rises. From the shores of Eastport you can watch deer, eagles, seals, and whales play in their natural environment. Eastport offers a storied, historic waterfront. With 28 buildings on the National Register of Historic Places, the downtown area is an easy walk from both Breakwater and Fish Piers. Here you will find a thriving arts community with many unique galleries and artisan shops, as well as restaurants offering fresh, locally caught seafood.



INVESTMENTS

The Breakwater Terminal Pier in downtown Eastport began reconstruction in 2015 and reopened in July 2017.

Installation of a new \$200,000 float system.

The Eastport Port Authority built a new Welcome Center in 2014 to house the offices of the Port Authority, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and the Chamber of Commerce, in addition to public restrooms and a conference space — all in one place.



HIGHLIGHTS

- Downtown Eastport is both a working waterfront and the location of the city's restaurants, shops, and galleries.
- Eastport is home to Old Sow, the largest natural whirlpool in the Western Hemisphere.
- Visit Raye's Mustard Mill and Museum. Quaint and authentic, winner of numerous awards, it is the only remaining traditional stone-ground mustard mill in North America.
- Sipayik, the Pleasant Point Passamaquoddy Bay Reservation, hosts a three-day Indian Days celebration every August.
- Hike the trails of Shackford Head State Park and take in the spectacular views of Cobscook Bay.
- Hop on a tour bus to Roosevelt Campobello International Park in New Brunswick and visit the summer retreat of FDR and Eleanor Roosevelt.
- The West Quoddy Head Lighthouse in Lubec is the easternmost point in the U.S.
- U.S. Coast Guard Station Eastport, U.S. Customs & Border Protection, Eastport Port Authority, and the Harbor Master's Office located at the head of the Breakwater Terminal make clearance into the U.S. a smooth experience.
